Qualifications:

Required: Ph.D. or Ed.D. with research and teaching interests in educational technology. Substantial successful middle or high school teaching experience. Knowledge of current research, pedagogy, and assessments in educational technology and a second content area such as mathematics, science, English, or social studies education. Demonstrated ability and willingness to work collaboratively with colleagues at the university and teachers in secondary schools. Commitment to working with an ethnically and culturally diverse student population.

Desirable: Experience supervising teachers, teaching credential or graduate-level courses, teaching online, developing software and/or websites, presenting papers at professional conferences, and conducting professional development.

CSUN is a Learning Centered University. The successful candidate will be expected to join faculty and staff in a commitment to active learning, to the assessment of learning outcomes, and to multiple pathways that enable students to graduate.

At time of appointment, the successful candidate, if not a U.S. citizen, must have authorization from the Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services to work in the United States.

Evidence of degree(s) required at time of hire.

Responsibilities: Develop and teach credential and MA courses in educational technology and another content area. Supervise student teachers/interns in field experience and score PACT Teaching Events in subject area of expertise. Participate in professional development activities, projects, or research at the university or local schools. Faculty at CSUN are expected to teach or supervise the equivalent of 12 units each semester and engage in scholarship as well as service to the university and community.

Interested candidates should submit a letter of application that addresses the qualifications and responsibilities described above, a current *curriculum vitae* with three or more references, and three current letters of recommendation.
