- To recognize a student of superior achievement with the potential for professional leadership in the classroom, preferably K-12.

## ELIGIBILITY:

- Applicants must be enrolled in the Michael D. Eisner College of Education this Spring 2010, in either a credential or master's program in teaching or therapy.
- Applicants should have a cumulative 3.0 grade point average in their undergraduate work.
